

SELECTION CRITERIA OF THE FLEMISH RESEARCH DATABASE

GENERAL

It is a 'Flemish research project'...

This database aims to provide a complete overview of Flemish research projects relating to Children's Rights. A project is defined as followed:

- runs over a longer period of time (no 'ad hoc' initiatives)
- based on a clear, distinguished source of finances
- initiated by a scientific or academic institute
- current as well as finished research projects
- 'Flemish': the project is initiated by one or more Flemish scientific or academic institute(s), but does not necessarily focus on a Flemish topic

CHILDREN'S RIGHTS

... about, or related to, Children's Rights

Following projects classify for the KeKi database:

- Projects that explicitly focus on Children's Rights as a research topic
- Projects about threats or abuses of Children's Rights (e.g. children in vulnerable situations)
- Projects about interventions aiming to improve Children's Rights (e.g. foster care, youth care...)
- Projects implementing Children's Rights in research methodology (e.g. extensive participatory methods with children)
- General databases that can be used to study Children's Rights (e.g. youth monitor)
- Child friendliness inquiries (e.g. child friendliness of specific cities, schools...)

Does *not* classify

- Etiological research about themes related to children's rights, such as causes of poverty, correlates of well-being... Projects including these kinds of topics can be consulted through the database of the Youth Research Platform (www.jeugdonderzoekplatform.be)
